ALL MY CHILDREN Kendall admits to Zach that Emma is Ryan's daughter but isn't crazy about the idea that she plans on keeping the truth from Ryan. JR makes a quickie call to his lawyer the minute he finds out that Babe and Josh kissed. Jack insists that Sean learn a lesson or two by sitting it out in jail, a form of tough love that Krystal wishes Adam would use on Colby. Derek shows a puzzled Zach a photo of his mother that he found in Zarf's London penthouse. Zach tells Derek that he's certain that the gardenias and ribbons are the killer's personal message to him. Danielle collapses after someone hiding in the wings poisons her. Zarf puts on a brave but duplicitous face by lying and telling Bianca that he dressed up like a woman for the "artistic experience." **THIS WEEK:** Zarf is already guilty in Zach's mind and is out to prove it for himself. Romeo said the band enjoys the smaller, more intimate venues they often play, and they consider Georgia a second home. "We've made a lot of good friends down there." The band's shows include everything from "edgy country to Southern rock" with a bit of R&B and bluegrass twang mixed in for good measure. Their song list includes covers of hits from such artists as Faith Hill, Alabama, Prince, Kelly Clarkson, The Rolling Stones and even Eminem, mixed in with a few of their own originals. The band is presently in discussions with a few record labels, and Romeo said there is

one deal already on the table. Of their shows, she added that meeting audience members up close and personal is the best part of the experience. "I love hearing the stories," she said, "when you've touched somebody a certain way [through a particular song]. It's about the people." As for their own material, which includes titles such as "Homewreckin' Man," "Skinniest Years of My Life," and "The One That Got Away," Romeo contends the band never lets a few stereotypes or double standards stand in the way of their inspiration to create good material. "We are women," she said, "we know most about that."

at the box office

Capsule reviews of films opening this week:
"Stomp the Yard" — The rhythmic step dancing is infectious in this otherwise formulaic underdog flick — so much so, you'll want to see more of it and less of a plot. It's good enough to make you wish that director Sylvain White had taken a documentary approach instead, something along the lines of David LaChapelle's 2005 film "Rize," about the rigorous, gravity-defying street dance styles of krumping and clowning. Instead, White's movie focuses on young, surly DJ (Columbus Short), who moves to Atlanta from Los Angeles after his younger brother is fatally shot in a fight. There he attends the fictional, historically black Truth University, where the fraternities and their step com-

petitions dominate the social scene. DJ's raw moves cause the school's top two houses to compete over him, and although he initially balks, he eventually gives in, is broken down and built back up as a better man. Short's performance is surprisingly free of melodrama but the script itself isn't; the overlong ending grows increasingly ridiculous with its twists and coincidences. Meagan Good, Darrin Henson and R&B singer Chris Brown co-star. PG-13 for a scene of violence, some sexual material and language. 113 min. Two stars out of four. "Alpha Dog" — They aren't exactly likable characters, the drug dealers and stoners and wannabe gangsters of "Alpha Dog." They're bored, white kids with too much money and time on their hands and, in their shallow es-

timation, nothing better to do than sit around getting high, playing video games and emulating the speech and bravado of their favorite rap videos. (Every other word is "chill," "dog" or an F-bomb. Word.) The situations become shrill, overlong and a bit repetitive (how many parties can these people attend over a three-day period?) but they also grow increasingly volatile, which allows for vibrant performances from a hot, young cast that includes Emile Hirsch, Ben Foster, Shawn Hatosy, Amanda Seyfried and Olivia Wilde. Justin Timberlake is surprisingly good as one of the kidnappers. But here, all buffed and tatted, he succeeds at digging deep dramatically, as well. Rated R for pervasive drug use and language, strong violence, sexuality and nudity. Running time: 117 minutes. Two and a half stars out of four. Also in theaters: "Freedom Writers" — The true story behind this classroom drama starring Hilary Swank is undeni-

ably amazing and inspiring. Idealistic rookie teacher Erin Gruwell came into a Long Beach, Calif., high school soon after the Rodney King riots in Los Angeles, defused the rancor among black, white, Hispanic and Asian teens and injected hope, common ground and academic achievement into their
