



## A Memorial Ceremony honoring Johann Michael HOCKERSMITH, Revolutionary War Veteran

### **Memorial Ceremony at Salt River Baptist Church, Lawrenceburg, KY**

I have always had strong feelings that everyone should have a grave stone, especially since I became interested in genealogy. In Michael Hockersmith's situation, since the burial site could not be established, a memorial stone was placed in the most probable location. When I became aware that the Veterans Administration would provide a grave or memorial stone for any veteran free of charge, my goal was to submit Michael's name and have a marker placed for him. The initial step in acquiring a stone was to access the veterans web site at [www.cem.va.gov/hmorder.htm](http://www.cem.va.gov/hmorder.htm). I copied the necessary forms and instructions from this site.

Since this was a stone for a veteran of the American Revolution, I contacted the Sons of the American Revolution (S.A.R.) and was given the name of Forrest Chilton from Louisville, Kentucky. Forrest is the organizer for a group of S.A.R. members that perform these ceremonies. I met with him in Louisville after visiting Anderson County and filled out the necessary forms to get started. During this meeting Forrest informed me that since Michael was an officer he would have been able to read and write. I was somewhat skeptical until Peg Kwadrat sent a court document written and signed by Michael Hockersmith.

After a short time, especially by government standards, I received a call from Mr. Chilton and after some discussion we agreed on a date and time for the ceremony. A few weeks before the ceremony, I made a trip to the Salt River Baptist Church cemetery and placed the stone for Michael.

#### Forrest Chilton

Lieutenant Michael Hockersmith served in the Maryland Militia from Frederick County in Captain William Shields' Company of the 3<sup>rd</sup> battalion (later the 35<sup>th</sup> battalion), which was organized in the fall of 1775. This company participated in the Battle of Quibbletown, New Jersey in March of 1777. They also participated in the Battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Whitehorse Tavern in Pennsylvania from September through October 1777.

It is also highly probable that this company was involved in the Battle at Yorktown, Virginia in 1781.

The following biography was compiled by Michael Ivan Mossburger, 4G-Grandson of Johann Michael Hockersmith, and was presented at the Memorial Ceremony conducted at the Salt River Baptist Church, Anderson County, Kentucky on October 22, 2005.

## Johann Michael Hockersmith

Biography by Michael Mossburger

Johann Michael Hockersmith was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania on July 14, 1743. He married Maria Margaretha Smith. Although no record of this marriage has been located, court records indicate they were husband and wife.

What we know about Michael's military service is found primarily in the Maryland State Archives. The militia company in which Michael served was formed in the fall of 1775 in Frederick County, Maryland. He was elected second lieutenant by the men enrolled in this company, which was commanded by Captain William Shields. The companies,

which were formed at this time, were later ordered to be joined into a battalion.

Michael's first commission was issued in November of 1775 by the Committee of Observation in Frederick County. His second commission as lieutenant was issued December 28, 1776 by the Maryland Council of Safety.

In January of 1777, the 35<sup>th</sup> battalion (formerly the 3<sup>rd</sup> battalion), which this company was a part of, received orders from the Continental Congress to march to New Jersey to reinforce Washington's Army as he retreated from New York.

With the help of the militia, the British advance was stopped and Washington's Army was saved. During this time, the battalion in which Michael was enrolled participated in the battle of Quibbletown, New Jersey, and by the end of March was ordered back to Maryland.

This company was again called in service near the end of August of 1777 for two months and during this time participated in the battles of Brandywine on September 11<sup>th</sup> and Germantown on October 4<sup>th</sup>.

In 1779, the same company of which John Shields was now captain, was involved in escorting British General Burgoyne's surrendered army through Maryland to prisons in Virginia.

Near the end of this long and difficult war, it is highly probable that Michael, along with the rest of the militia company, participated in the Battle of Yorktown, Virginia and was present when Lord Cornwallis surrendered the fort under his command.

After the Revolutionary War, approximately 1791, Michael, his brother Conrad Edward, along with Michael Hockersmith Jr. made the long and dangerous journey to Kentucky. These

pioneers settled in the Jessamine Creek area of Fayette County, which later became Jessamine County and lived there for several years.

Michael and his brother Edward joined the Kentucky Mounted Volunteers July 14, 1794, which was Michael's 51<sup>st</sup> birthday. This unit was a militia group and participated in the Battle of Fallen Timbers August 20<sup>th</sup>.

Michael Hockersmith Jr. purchased 100 acres on the waters of Salt Creek in Franklin County, Kentucky February 19<sup>th</sup>, 1810. Michael Sr. is found in this household on the census for that year. The last record of this courageous patriot soldier can be found on the June 1811 tax list of Franklin County, Kentucky. There is no record of Michael Sr. on the June 1812 tax list. He is apparently deceased by this time.

The land where Michael spent his last days is a short distance west of the Salt River Baptist Church. Although the burial place of this great patriot has been lost over the passage of time, the placing of this memorial will forever remind us of his great sacrifice to bring about the birth of our country, The United States of America.

Jeff is also the 6G-Grandson of Johann Michael HOCKERSMITH via the following lineage: Isaac D. HOCKERSMITH married his 2<sup>nd</sup> Cousin once removed, Olivia HOCKERSMITH, d/o Daniel, s/o Edward, probably s/o Johann Michael HOCKERSMITH.

### **Battle of Quibbletown, New Jersey**

From what data I can find concerning this battle, it would be better described as a series of skirmishes. The significance of these skirmishes is that the American militia inflicted considerable casualties to the British forces. These skirmishes, and many more like them, provided Gen. George Washington's Army the time it needed to escape the pursuing British forces of Gen. Howe.

The following seven entries cover the timeframe that Lt. Michael Hockersmith would have been present and are taken from Battles and Skirmishes of the American Revolution in New Jersey, David C. Munn, 1941:

### **Battle of Brandywine, Pennsylvania**

On September 11, 1777, the hamlet of Chadds Ford played host to one of the largest and deadliest battles of the American Revolutionary War, today called the Battle of Brandywine. An estimated 29,000 British and American troops gathered at the fledgling town populated mostly by peaceful Quakers.

Britain's campaign for 1777 was to split off New England from New York, obtain and hold western and northern New York, and take Philadelphia. This last objective was assigned to the Commander-in-Chief of the British army in America, Sir William Howe. Howe believed that the capture of

Philadelphia, capital of the nation and a major supply center, would demoralize the Americans and ensure his victory over them.

Accordingly, in July of 1777, Howe and his army sailed 264 ships south toward Philadelphia from their encampment in New Jersey. As they approached the city, however, Howe was informed of American fortifications and a small navy force in and along the Delaware River, blocking his path. He changed course to the Chesapeake Bay, planning to land at Elk Ferry (about 8 miles below the present Elkton, Maryland) and march his 4,000 to 5,000 German Hessians and 11,000 to 13,000 British troops thirty miles northeast to Philadelphia.

Opposing him was General George Washington, Commander-in-Chief of the American (or Continental) army. He had won two winter engagements over British outposts at Trenton and Princeton on December 26, 1776, and January 3, 1777, then had moved his army into quarters near Morristown, New Jersey. He had spent the summer of 1777 encamped in the secure Watchung Mountains of New Jersey, descending to skirmish with the British.

In July, when he learned of Howe's movement southward, Washington marched his own 11,000 man force south to Wilmington, Delaware, arriving on August 25th. Howe landed the same day at Elk Head. By September 3, the majority of Howe's army, recovered from malnutrition suffered during the month-long sail, started marching toward Philadelphia. The next five days saw the two armies positioning themselves along the White Clay Creek, west of Newport and Wilmington, but neither general engaged.

Washington expected Howe to march toward him in Wilmington as the city was situated between Howe at Elk Head and his destination of Philadelphia. Howe, however, preferred to meet the rebel force elsewhere, thus preventing Washington from making use of the advantageous ground he occupied there. He feinted north towards Pennsylvania, forcing Washington to change his defensive ground. The latter chose the Brandywine River in Chadds Ford. The Continentals reached the Brandywine on the 9th and camped on its east side. There they prepared to make a stand.

Washington positioned his troops on the high ground east of the Brandywine River, a natural barrier and an excellent defensive position with advantageous high ground behind and thickly wooded slopes offering concealment. He positioned brigades and regiments at the main fords (shallow places where an army could cross), including Buffington's Ford (about a mile above today's bridge at Lenape), Chadds Ford, and Pyle's Ford (south of Route 1). One advisor counseled that Howe would try to outflank them by sending his main force northward while a decoy force attacked at Chadds Ford. Washington was aware of this possibility, but had been assured by local informants that Jefferis' Ford, the next ford above Buffington's, was difficult to cross, because it was very deep, more than half the height of a man, and that the road southward was poor. Washington, therefore, expected the British to cross at Chadds Ford and, accordingly, put the strength of his army there.

Howe, however, had indeed decided to repeat the flanking strategy he had used successfully at Long Island. He sent half his army, about an 8,000 man troop,

straight to Washington at Chadds Ford to act as decoy. This force was led by Hessian general Wilhelm von Knyphausen who had a company of men equipped with the new rapid-firing breech-loading rifles invented by Patrick Ferguson. The rest of Howe's army marched north 17 miles to cross the Brandywine above the fords that Washington guarded. Howe then marched south, down what is today Birmingham Road, to launch a surprise attack on the right flank of Washington.

Washington had been receiving conflicting reports throughout the morning about the location of Howe's army. Was there British troop movement near Jefferis' Ford? Had Howe indeed split his army? Or was the force united and preparing for a full frontal assault? He considered crossing the river to launch an assault on Von Knyphausen but held off. He didn't receive a reliable report until early afternoon, too late. The British were marching toward Birmingham Friends Meeting House. The Continentals scrambled to reform themselves to meet this attack, attempting to take the high ground behind the meeting house.

Their line not completely formed, the Continentals fell back, leaving behind their dead and wounded along with various pieces of equipment and artillery. Fighting continued until dusk, by which time ammunition was running low or was completely gone. Washington's army retreated to Chester, twelve miles east, in good spirits despite the defeat, which they attributed to bad intelligence reports rather than to a lack of fighting skill on their part. "Notwithstanding the misfortune of the day, I am happy to find the troops in good spirits, and I hope another time we shall compensate for the losses now sustained," Washington wrote

to Congress. On September 12th, Washington issued orders for the troops to press on to Germantown.

The exhausted British did not pursue the Americans through the night, but remained behind, camping on the battlefield, and treating the wounded and burying the dead.

Casualties on both sides appear to have been heavy, although battle reports of the day and modern estimates vary. About 300 Americans were taken prisoner, 400 to 800 killed, and 600 to 800 wounded. British losses were heavier—somewhere between 600 to 2,000.

During the five days following the battle, the British camped in the area from Dilworthtown to the present day Brandywine Battlefield Park, and ransacked Chadds Ford houses and properties, looting books, furnishings, livestock, food, clothing, and money. They then moved north toward Paoli and marched into Philadelphia on September 26th. They occupied the city throughout the winter while the American army languished at Valley Forge.

Although the Battle of Brandywine receives scant attention in the annals of military history, it is significant as one of the largest land battles, as the only battle in which Washington and Howe fought head to head, as a great morale booster for the American army, and is thought to be one of the first battles in which the Ferguson rifle was used and in which the Betsy Ross flag was flown.

### **Battle of Germantown, Pennsylvania on October 4th 1777**

Following the British capture of Philadelphia after the Battle of Brandywine, Howe's troops encamped in Germantown to the North of the city. The camp stretched in a line astride the main northern road.

Washington determined to surprise the British army in camp. His plan required a strong column under Major General Nathaniel Greene (with McDougall, Muhlenberg, Stephen and Scott) to attack the right wing of the British army comprising Grant's and Donop's troops, the second column which he commanded (with Stirling and Sullivan) to advance down the main Philadelphia road and launch an assault on the British centre, while forces of militia attacked each wing of the British force comprising on the right the Queen's Rangers and on the left near the Schuylkill River, Hessian Jagers and British Light Infantry.

Washington's plan required the four attacks to be launched "precisely at 5 o'clock with charged bayonets and without firing". The intention was to surprise the whole British army in much the way the Hessians had been surprised at Trenton.

The American columns started along their respective approach roads on the evening of 3rd October 1777. Dawn found the American forces well short of their start line for the attack and there was an encounter with the first British picquet which fired its guns to warn of the attack. The outpost was supported by a battalion of light infantry and the 40th Foot under Colonel Musgrave. It took a substantial part of Sullivan's division to drive back the British contingent.

General Howe rode forward, initially thinking the advanced force was being attacked by a raiding party, his view impeded by a thickening fog that clouded the field for the rest of the day.

During the fighting Musgrave caused 6 companies of the 40th to fortify the substantial stone house of Chief Justice Chew and use it as a strong point. The American advance halted while furious attacks were launched against the house aided by an artillery barrage.

assailed for a full hour by the infantry and guns of several American brigades. The rest of Greene's division launched a savage attack on the British line as planned and broke through, capturing a number of British troops.

In the meantime Sullivan and Wayne had continued past the Chew House and begun their attack. In the fog Wayne's and Stephen's brigades encountered each other and exchanged fire. Both brigades broke and fled.

Sullivan's brigade was attacked on both flanks, by Grant with the 5th and 55th Foot on his left and by Brigadier Grey on his right. Sullivan's brigade broke. The British then turned on Greene's isolated division capturing Colonel Matthews and his 9th Virginia Regiment.

Attacked by the British Guards, the 25th and 27th Foot, Greene withdrew up the main road to the North West, assisted by the efforts of Muhlenberg's brigade. As the American army retreated its condition deteriorated and Washington was forced to withdraw some sixteen miles, harried by the British light dragoons. Most of the American militia forces did not develop their attacks and finally retreated.

Hearing the firing, Stephen heading the other main attack, ignored his orders to continue along the lane to the attack of the British right wing, swung to the right and made for the Chew House. His brigade joined the attack on the house which was
